Heritage activities include school visits, photographic display by Media students, talks and tours, heritage coffee mornings, meet the stonemasons, tower tours - ringing chamber and top of tower, video filming for top of tower and craft activities. SHARP will gain further knowledge of this Anglo-Saxon population and will disseminate this to the general public through further activities such as open days, publications, lectures and website content. Organise drone flights to survey relevant areas (subject to appropriate permissions) to give volunteers additional research images to work with. A video will be made of drone footage, which will be publicly accessible. Includes talks, publication, public lectures. Deposition of project material in the relevant local archives and on line. The 'Memory Minx' will tour a range of locations throughout the County to engage with local communities - acting as a center piece to attract conversation but also as a functional tool to enable people view stories and to contribute their own. Children from two Essex special schools – the Pioneer Special and The Endeavour – will visit Chelmsford Museum on eight occasions to explore the world of childhood before the days of plastic toys and computer games. Each visit will be evaluated by Autism and Nature. Posters produced by the children will be shared with the other children in the schools, their parents and carers who will be invited to view the work, and the other teachers.
