New funding for Scotland's biodiversity

Roseanna Cunningham MSP launches the Biodiversity Challenge Fund. Scottish Natural Heritage The National Lottery Heritage Fund and Scottish Natural Heritage are working together to fund projects which will help save endangered species, improve habitats and increase access to nature.

Scottish Natural Heritage recently launched the Biodiversity Challenge Fund (BCF) with funding of up to £2million to support large-scale projects which will improve the health and resilience of the natural environment. The first year of the fund is now open, with up to £1million of investment available in 2019/20.

The National Lottery Heritage Fund continues to <u>prioritise nature</u> and wants to encourage projects applying to the Biodiversity Challenge Fund to also apply for match funding up to £100,000.
