

Funding boost for V&A at Dundee

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Designed by the celebrated Japanese architect Kengo Kuma, V&A at Dundee is also the flagship for Dundee's ambitious plans for its waterfront redevelopment. The HLF grant will primarily support the capital costs of the building, in particular the development of its Scottish Design Galleries dedicated to Scotland's outstanding design heritage, as well as its ambitious education work across the country.

Philip Long, Director of V&A at Dundee, highlighted the importance of having the HLF seal of approval for the project: "Today's news underlines just how far the project has come. HLF have scrutinised our proposal from top to bottom so this award is a massive vote of confidence in the project. The new institution is a partnership between the prestigious Victoria and Albert Museum, the Universities of Abertay and Dundee, Dundee City Council and Scottish Enterprise. HLF's award is the result of more than two years of work from across this creative partnership, to whom we are indebted.

"Scotland's achievement in design is world-class and centuries old. The development of V&A at Dundee will for the first time provide Scotland with a dedicated centre to celebrate that achievement, as well as a place to see and understand the design creativity of other countries and cultures. I'm especially excited by the way in which V&A at Dundee will work with communities, designers and businesses nationwide, taking inspiration from our heritage to inspire new creativity and enterprise. We are now looking forward to being on site and getting on with our pre-opening

programme across the country.”

Dame Seona Reid, Deputy Chair of the Heritage Lottery Fund, said: “The Heritage Lottery Fund is delighted to start 2014 with good news for Dundee and good news for Scotland. For hundreds of years Scots have made their mark in the world of international design. V&A at Dundee can now present this rich seam of talent to the world, in a stunning building which itself reflects the international cutting-edge design which will also be presented.

“We are delighted that in this, the Year of Homecoming, Dundee is one of the many cities across the UK, that will reap the long-lasting benefit of Heritage Lottery funding. Today’s decision brings HLF’s investment in Scottish museums and art galleries to over £177m. This new world-class museum is an exciting addition to the sector providing a source of education and delight for visitors, while making a transformational contribution to the cultural, social and economic regeneration of the city.”

This excellence of Scottish design is no more apparent than in Dundee which is home to a thriving academic, artistic and creative community.” “The hard work in constructing what is sure to be the centrepiece in Dundee’s dramatic waterfront transformation is well underway. I look forward to seeing the excellence of Scottish design both past and present showcased in a world-class museum that will inspire generations to come.”

The Scottish Design Galleries will provide a dedicated home designed to tell the narrative of Scotland’s rich and varied contribution to the global design stage. The content of the galleries is currently being developed but will range from the 17th century to the present day across all media: from furniture and fashion to architecture and game design. Leading names could include Phoebe Anna Traquair, Charles Rennie Mackintosh, Edinburgh Weavers, Sir Basil Spence, Holly Fulton and Alexander McQueen.

The construction of V&A at Dundee is on schedule for a site start in the summer. It is anticipated the building will complete in late 2016, with the first full year of programming in 2017.

V&A at Dundee will be an international centre for design, housed in a world-class building at the heart of Dundee’s revitalised waterfront. It will host major exhibitions, celebrate our design heritage,

inspire and promote contemporary talent, and encourage design innovation for the future. The new institution is a partnership between the prestigious Victoria and Albert Museum, the Universities of Abertay and Dundee, Dundee City Council and Scottish Enterprise. HLF's award is the result of more than two years of work from across this creative partnership, to whom we are indebted. V&A at Dundee will inform, educate and entertain but also explicitly, through its wider programmes, intends to generate new creativity and innovation across Scotland.

V&A at Dundee will have access to thousands of Scottish-related items from the V&A's world-renowned collection for its Scottish Design Galleries, supplemented by objects loaned from collections of national significance across Scotland and beyond. In parallel, our temporary exhibition galleries will host a variety of outstanding international touring exhibitions from the V&A each year.

V&A at Dundee is being delivered by Design Dundee Ltd, a partnership between the Victoria and Albert Museum – the world's greatest museum of art and design – and Dundee City Council, the University of Dundee, the University of Abertay Dundee and Scottish Enterprise.

The Scottish Government has committed £15m towards the project's £45million capital budget. The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) has today awarded a further £9.4m, plus £200,000 development funding. Creative Scotland is currently considering the museum's Round 2 submission and is expected to make a decision over the coming months. A further £15m is also being sought from private sources, corporates, generous philanthropic pledges and gifts with £6.7m already raised towards this goal.
