- Projects that are nominated must complete The National Lottery Awards 2012 entry form

- Shortlisted projects will compete in two rounds of public voting later in the year to determine the winner. All voting will be independently verified
- Since The National Lottery began in 1994, Lottery players have raised over £27billion for Good Causes and over 370,000 grants have been awarded across the UK
