Swansea resident Uzo Iwobi has provided an outstanding contribution to heritage in her 30 years living in Wales. Among her many achievements, Uzo founded two charities: Race Council Cymru and the African Community Centre. She is the Specialists Advisor for Equality to the Welsh Government, and she is a professor at the University of Wales Trinity Saint David.

She was selected by The National Lottery Heritage Fund earlier this year as one of [eight 'heritage heroes' whose photographs were projected onto Stonehenge](#) in recognition of their incredible hard work and efforts to support heritage during the pandemic.
