Museums in Ripon



Lives Unravelled exhibition at the Workhouse Museum, Ripon, Yorkshire

Three popular Ripon museums ? the Workhouse Museum, Prison & Police Museum and Courthouse Museum ? have reopened with a brand-new exhibition inspired by the theme of workhouse women.

Bamburgh Castle



Magnificent Bamburgh Castle, which includes 14 state rooms and the Armstrong and Aviation Museum, also reopened yesterday after being closed for six months. The inspiration for epic historical saga The Last Kingdom and the real Bebbanburg, the 1400-year-old fortress stands 150 feet above sea level on the Northumberland coast.

Horniman Museum and Gardens

At Horniman Museum in London, the natural history gallery and nature base, world gallery and music gallery are all open, along with the exhibition, From Birth Till Death: Scrolled Life Stories. The gardens are open, and you can book tickets to visit the butterfly house.

Black Country Living Museum



The Black Country Living Museum, an award-winning open-air museum in Dudley, has also reopened its doors after five months. The West Midlands museum has recently been acting as a vaccination centre for people to get their coronavirus (COVID-19) jabs. It is currently undergoing a significant transformation to share stories of life in the 1940s to the 1960s, thanks to National Lottery players.
