Rhondda Heritage / Treftadaeth Y Rhondda

Applicant: Rhondda Radio Ltd

Project summary: The creation of a physical heritage trail, spanning Rhondda, in several distinct 'stations', a hybrid training programme, upskilling volunteers in several areas including storytelling, interviewing and content editing.

Decision: Award grant of £85,008 (100%)

Project summary: A one-year project aiming to bring groups of older people and children together to work on intergenerational projects across South Wales, based on the broad theme of 'Listening and Learning'.
