

HLF committee for Yorkshire and the Humber welcomes new Chair Gary Verity

Recent highlights from around the region awarded by the Yorkshire and the Humber Committee include town-centre regeneration schemes for Keighley and Pontefract; initial backing to Sheffield Cathedral to improve the building as a destination for both locals and tourists; development money to an exciting new project which will enable new speakers to be trained to pass on the legacy of the Holocaust to future generations; and approval for a project to restore the 1904 Autocar – the original predecessor to today's modern trains.
