Past involvements have included the Yorkshire Archives Council and the Yorkshire Cultural Consortium; currently he is a council member of the British Records Association, and a member of University of Durham's Collections Committee.

When time permits he enjoys researching and writing local history, and undertaking annual voluntary surveys of breeding birds.
