St Albans gets go-ahead for 'cultural beacon'

This ambitious redevelopment project will create a 'one-stop shop' - celebrating local heritage and culture - right in the centre of the city.

The project is a partnership between St Albans City and District Council, St Albans Museums and Galleries Trust and the University of Hertfordshire. The overall cost will be £7.75m with the council committed to providing £3.3m.
