With money from the National Lottery, historic Ampleforth Abbey in North Yorkshire is set to undertake £2.9million of refurbishment work.

The Abbey and its landscape, home to Britain's largest Benedictine monastic community, will be conserved with £2.9m from HLF. Both the historic Monk's Bridge and Abbey Church will be repaired and the 59 resident monks will become more involved with day-to-day visitor activities.
