Celebrations as gorgeous Bridgford Hall reopens

After a year-long £2.3million refurbishment made possible by National Lottery players, Bridgford Hall is now open for business as an aparthotel and civil wedding ceremony venue.

£1.5m from HLF was secured to enable the renovation of the beautiful Grade II listed Georgian building in Bridgford Park, which officially opened this week.

This is the first project completed in the East Midlands under HLF's Heritage Enterprise programme, which funds vital repairs and conservation work needed to convert derelict, vacant buildings into new, usable and sustainable spaces.

The 250 year-old building has been modernised, creating seven well-appointed apartments on the first and second floors, as well as enhancing accommodation for Nottinghamshire County Council's registration service on the ground floor.
