Armagh City restoration given National Lottery boost

St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council (ACDC) Funding raised by National Lottery players is helping to regenerate the historic heart of Armagh City.

The Armagh City Townscape Heritage project is underway having received a £1.9million grant from HLF.

The funding will be used to restore a number of buildings within the Conservation Area and provide opportunities for local people to learn more about the iconic built and cultural heritage of the city.

Twenty-eight properties will be repaired and more than 5,000 square meters of historic floor space will be returned to use. New jobs will be created, and the project will help to attract millions of pounds worth of additional investment to the area.

Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council will lead the five-year project.
