9 fossil facts: did you know?

- 1. Fossils are the remains of ancient animals and plants, the traces or impressions of living things from past geologic ages, or the traces of their activities
- 2. Fossils have been found on every continent on Earth
- 3. The fossil of a bone doesn't have any bone in it! A fossilised object has the same shape as the original object, but is chemically more like a rock
- 4. The Lapworth Museum of Geology explores life over the past 3.5 billion years and has one of the UK's most outstanding geological collections which contains in excess of 250,000 specimens
- 5. The only direct way we have of learning about dinosaurs is by studying fossils
- 6. The word fossil comes from the Latin word fossilis, which means, "dug up".
- 7. Fossilised poo is called coprolites and scientists have found coprolites from Tyrannosaurus Rex dinosaurs that contain bits of crushed bones
- 8. The Lapworth Museum is named after Charles Lapworth, one of the most important and influential geologists of the late 19th and early 20th centuries
- 9. You can now visit the results of the stunning £2.7million redevelopment at the Lapworth Museum and learn more about fossils
