Emily has a Masters Degree in Conservation Biology and has held leadership roles in a range of conservation organisations including London Wildlife Trust, the South Downs National Park Authority, Butterfly Conservation, the Natural History Museum and the Zoological Society of London. She currently works for the National Trust, looking after the Trust's properties in Surrey and Sussex and leading a team of experts including building surveyors, curators, conservators, estate managers and planning advisers. The National Trust is the UK's largest conservation organisation with over 5 million members.
