And over the last 25 years, £40 billion has been raised by the Lottery for good causes, and I'm really pleased to say more than £850 million has gone to helping biodiversity; richness of life in the UK, £900 million to parks – improving there, so green spaces have really prospered because of that Lottery grant system.
