The project will create the opportunity to learn about the history of the church through a varied programme of engaging activities. 2.	St Peter's Highfields Repair Project	St Peter's Highfields is a Grade II listed Anglican Church in the Diocese of Leicester. Capital works comprise of repairs to stonework and roofing to the tower, improvements to access and repairs to the clock faces and windows in the tower. Activities will draw on the multi-faith heritage of the church and partnerships with local schools.	St Peter's Parochial Church Council	Award grant of £158,900 (55%)
