1.	75 Years of Citizens Advice County Durham: Stories from the Local Community	During this one year project participants will use personal histories and County Durham Citizens Advice Bureau archives held by County Durham Record Office to research local social history and the help offered by. County Durham Citizens Advice Bureau. Client and staff points of view will be documented. Outputs include oral histories, a YouTube film, public talks, a touring exhibition (venues include Beamish, local libraries, advice bureaux and the Town Hall), an education pack, a booklet and stories in the local media. 2.	Teachers.....Remembering, shaping and sharing the North East.	This project will look at the heritage of teaching and teachers in the North East over the last 50 years. Workshops will be used to collect oral histories. A number of the stories will then be followed in more detail through the production of a short film. The material collected will be used to produce a pop-up exhibition and booklet, which will tour community venues. A celebration event for the project will be held to launch the film, exhibition and website.	National Union of Teachers	Reject
3.	Berwick-upon-Tweed - Our Families Project	The project is part of the year- long Berwick 900 Festival in 2015 to celebrate 900 years of Berwick. A series of events will explore themes such as the fishing industry, the Freeman's Guild, food and drink production, and military and maritime heritage. This project will focus on the research of a range of family names associated with the town, using individual and family stories as a way of linking together all the themed events. Volunteers will be recruited to undertake the research of specific family names. Training will be provided by Berwick Record Office	Berwick 900	Reject
4.	Into the Trenches	Theatre Centre's production 'The Muddy Choir' is based on the stories of 3 soldiers from Sunderland. The piece will be brought to the region and used to inspire young people to engage further with FWW heritage. 150 school pupils will take part in a heritage workshop led by a DLI educator and a drama workshop. They will receive website training and view archive material such as letters, newspapers and diaries. A creative writing workshop will see participants create a 'character' that embodies the story they wish to tell. Through this character a dramatic monologue will be devised which they will then perform.	Theatre Centre	Award Grant of £24,600 (100%)

5.	Provide Walls of Honor for the fallen in the Town Memorial Park	This year long project aims to research and commemorate the soldiers from Newbiggin by the Sea who gave their lives in the First World War, the Second World War and in conflicts post-1945. The project will construct two memorial walls, made and carved in Portland Stone, in the centre of Newbiggin Memorial Park. These walls will be engraved with the names of all the soldiers who gave their lives in service. Pupils from the local primary school will be encouraged to carry out research for displays and to take part in FWW Centenary Commemoration events. The research carried out will result in the creation of a 'Book of Honour' which will go on display within Newbiggin Maritime Centre. 6.	Linnels Mill conservation and reintroduction of head race from Devils Water	This nine month project aims to conserve Linnels Mill and its associated machinery, to reintroduce the headrace and water features, and to provide opportunities for people to access and learn about the heritage of the site. External repairs to the mill building including: replacement windows; re-pointing and crack repair; removal of vegetation; re-roofing; works to roof/surface water drainage; repair of chimney stack; and the introduction of gravity fed grout into the wall core. Internal works including: work to masonry; carpentry repairs; stone steps repair; and lintel replacement. There will be the development of a project website to provide access to material on the history of the mill and its restoration..	Ashley Winter	Award Grant of £82,300 (94%)
7.	Creation of village war memorial and book on the fallen of WW1and WW11 and ADEN	This eight month project was developed to engage the local community with their First World War heritage and to erect a new war memorial within the village to commemorate those who died in both the First and Second World Wars. From the application it is clearly shown that the community activity began in early 2014 and the memorial for which funding is also sought was unveiled by the Duke of Northumberland on the 3 August 2014. As a result of this, with the majority of activity having already taken place, the application is not fundable.	Shilbottle Parish Council	Reject
8.	Cautionary Tales and WW1 Explorations at the Literary & Philosophical Society	This project will be delivered in partnership with the Lit&Phil, Walkergate Primary School and Juice Festival. Lit&Phil's first children's book collection was donated in 1914 and will form the starting point for Walkergate pupil's engagement with the Lit&Phil's collections. A facilitator will adopt the role of Marion Headley, a Lit&Phil staff member who was promoted to Head Librarian when the previous Librarian went to fight. The pupils will 'help' Marion accessioning the books, then begin exploring other collection items. A strong personal story will be explored by the pupils with themes of the home front, front line and women at work being explored. Pupils will reflect on how life has changed 100 years on. Outputs will be presented during Juice Festival and include creative writing, production of a wartime lecture and an immersive tour through the library	November Club	Award Grant of £8,000 (62%)

9.	Killingworth World War 1 Commemoration Project	This 16 month project will focus on the First World War (FWW) memorials in the villages across Killingworth parish. Research will be carried out on the establishment of the memorials and the 267 names inscribed. Further research will also focus on those from the parish who died but are not named on the memorials. Young people will make visits to various FWW exhibitions to explore the role of the Tyne, and artists' experiences of the conflict. Four lectures and discussion sessions led by experts will be held at George Stephenson High School and open to the whole community. Members of the community will be encouraged to contribute stories and material which will be used in exhibitions and to enhance research.	St.John's Church, Killingworth	Award Grant of £10,000 (100%)
10.	WW1 Childhood NE Project	This year-long project will focus on the lives of children in the North East during the First World War. It will collate information about important events such as the Washington and Usworth Children's Strike, and the Hartlepool bombardment which left 15 children dead. A research e-toolkit will be produced and promoted to schools as a free downloadable resource. Youth delegates will encourage young people to visit museums and archives, and make contact with local history groups to help conduct research. Findings will be made available through a website.
