3	St Marys Moseley Churchyard Access and Heritage Project	The three-year project will repair infrastructure, landscape and improve access to the churchyard of St Mary's, a Grade II church whose churchyard contains a Grade II 1920 war memorial and a WWI Commonwealth War Grave. 4	Growing from your Roots	The project will work with two community groups to explore the UK's diverse heritage of growing multicultural crops and through this increase engagement with BAME communities	Garden Organic	Award Grant of £71,900 (93%)
5	Hooked into our Past	The project will involve a group of young children in a project focussing on the heritage of the Alvechurch Fishery and nearby canal. The project will be delivered, mainly through angling and habitat creation along the canal.
