Reports

1. Chair's report

Gary had also attended the Green Howards annual service in Richmond. Gary would be attending the opening of the Captain Cook Memorial Museum in Whitby the following day.

This pro rata budget would give an equal chance of success across the two meetings.

Item 8: Doncaster Mansion House – Gary Verity declared a conflict of interest as Welcome to Yorkshire had provided a letter of support which contained his electronic signature as Chief Executive. The Committee agreed that John Williams would take the chair for the discussion and prioritisation of this item.

SP3 Grant increase/decrease

7. Restoration of NER 1904 petrol electric autocar and coach; HG-08-12977

CYH 2015 (2)

North Eastern Railway 1903 Autocar Trust sought a grant increase to allow them to complete the restoration of the world's first electric autocar and a trailer coach for use on the Yorkshire Dales Railway and at Beamish Open Air Museum.

The Committee **awarded** a grant increase of £65,200 to make a total grant of £531,000 (81%).

- 8. Doncaster Mansion House: the Georgian Heart of the Borough's heritage; HG-14-08120 CYH 2015 (2)

Gary Verity declared a conflict of interest and left the room for the discussion and prioritisation of this item, with John Williams taking the chair during this time

Doncaster Metropolitan Borough Council sought a first round pass of £1,800,300, including development funding of £175,900 (90% of total eligible development costs) towards bringing Doncaster Mansion House back into full use. This would be achieved through a varied activity programme to engage audiences with Doncaster's Georgian heritage, period redecoration within the Mansion House and the provision of interactive interpretation. The Mansion House archives would also be digitised to make them more accessible to a wider audience. The scheme would complement a separate non-HLF funded programme of conservation works being undertaken by the Council.

The Committee agreed that the application represented a low priority for support and rejected it.

Restoration and Preservation of Stained Glass Windows In All Saints Church, North Street, York; HG-14-08314 CYF

All Saints North Street, York sought a first round pass of £513,600 including development funding of £12,200 (95% of total eligible development costs) to preserve its nationally important collection of medieval stained glass windows and to engage people with these and the wider heritage of the church. The windows would be conserved and protected through the installation of isothermal glazing to prevent further deterioration. The stories of the windows would be made accessible to a wider audience through new interpretation and a programme of activities.

The Committee rejected the application.

11. Sheffield 1916: Steel, Steam and Power Alison Costigan; HG-13-21117

CYH 2015 (2)

Sheffield Industrial Museums Trust Ltd sought a grant for a programme of works centred on the River Don Engine at Kelham Island Museum. The boiler which provides steam to the engine is in urgent need of replacement. This would be replaced, which would allow the River Don Engine to be continue to run, maintaining its conservation and its role as the Museum's most popular exhibit. The old boiler would be displayed to allow visitors to see its workings. The Engine Room, which would house the new boiler, would be opened up to the public for the first time. Interpretation would also be developed to explore Sheffield's role in the production of heavy armour plate for the Royal Navy warships of the First World Wars. A First World War era worker's home would be recreated.

The Committee had awarded a first round pass of £419,200, including development funding of £29,300 in September 2014. They noted that the grant request represented an uplift of £38,200.

The Committee agreed that the application represented a high priority for support and awarded a grant of £428,100 (84% of total eligible project costs).

Townscape Heritage:

12. Beverley Road Townscape Heritage Scheme; TH-13-06098 CYH 2015 (2)

Hull City Council sought a grant for a Townscape Heritage scheme based in the Beverley Road conservation area in Hull. The scheme would deliver a balance of works to improve the area, including property repairs, shop front improvements, boundary re-instatements and improvements to green spaces. Complementary learning and activity programmes would be delivered.

The Board had awarded a first round pass of £1,666,900 including a development grant of £69,900 in January 2014.

The Committee agreed that the application represented a high priority for support and awarded a grant of £1,597,000 (59% of total eligible costs).
